# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Masters Swimming WA has had a strong year in terms of membership growth and development of programmes to support our swimmers. The year started off with the appointment of a new Executive Officer - Sophie Row who has settled into the role with ease.

A number of exciting events occurred in 2018 to showcase our sport and promote us as the number one organisation for adult swimming. In April, Western Australia hosted the 43rd Masters Swimming Australia National Championships. These championships attracted a record number of swimmers for WA and allowed us to secure some extra funds which will be used to develop special programmes for members and clubs. MSWA Nationals Organising Committee, technical officials and volunteers should be congratulated for running such a world class event.

Utilising funds raised from the Nationals, MSWA have developed a newly branded open water swim series to draw together the swims that are hosted by our clubs. An exciting new initiative saw the launch of 'WOW Swims, the community swim series for all', our new open water swim 'brand' promoting the seven open water swims hosted by clubs and MSWA. With an integrated marketing approach through the new WOW Swims website, Facebook page, new branded signage and equipment for the swims and a more collaborative promotional approach, registrations for each swim have increased substantially, with each swim achieving record numbers. The foundations laid this season bode well for future years in what is becoming a very competitive market. Highlighting our inclusive community atmosphere in unique and iconic settings will continue to help us differentiate our swims.

During the year, the Board and various stakeholders worked diligently to draw up the new Strategic Plan for 2019 - 2022, which will steer many future initiatives. It is an exciting time for Masters Swimming WA and all our clubs and members as we introduce new initiatives in the future as part of a growth plan.

Considerable time was spent drawing up new Rules of Association as well several other new internal policies to assist in developing good governance in the way we manage the organisation. The legal assistance of our sponsors, Hopgood Ganim through the drafting process of the new Rules of Association was invaluable.

I am excited to continue the involvement of my predecessor in being an active part of the Aquatic Sports Steering Group (ASSG). During July 2018, a travelling road show visited Kalgoorlie running a joint promotion known as the 'Goldfields Splash'. This travelling roadshow concept will be rolled out across other regions during 2019 and 2020.

to try out some of these meets if you haven't already. They truly provide a friendly and supportive environment to dip your toe into more competitive swimming.

On behalf of MSWA, I would like to recognise and thank all our sponsors and stakeholders that have supported MSWA throughout 2018: MSA, DLGSC, Healthway promoting the LiveLighter message, Hopgood Ganim lawyers and asb Marketing. Thank you all for your ongoing support, which has been vital to our sustainability.

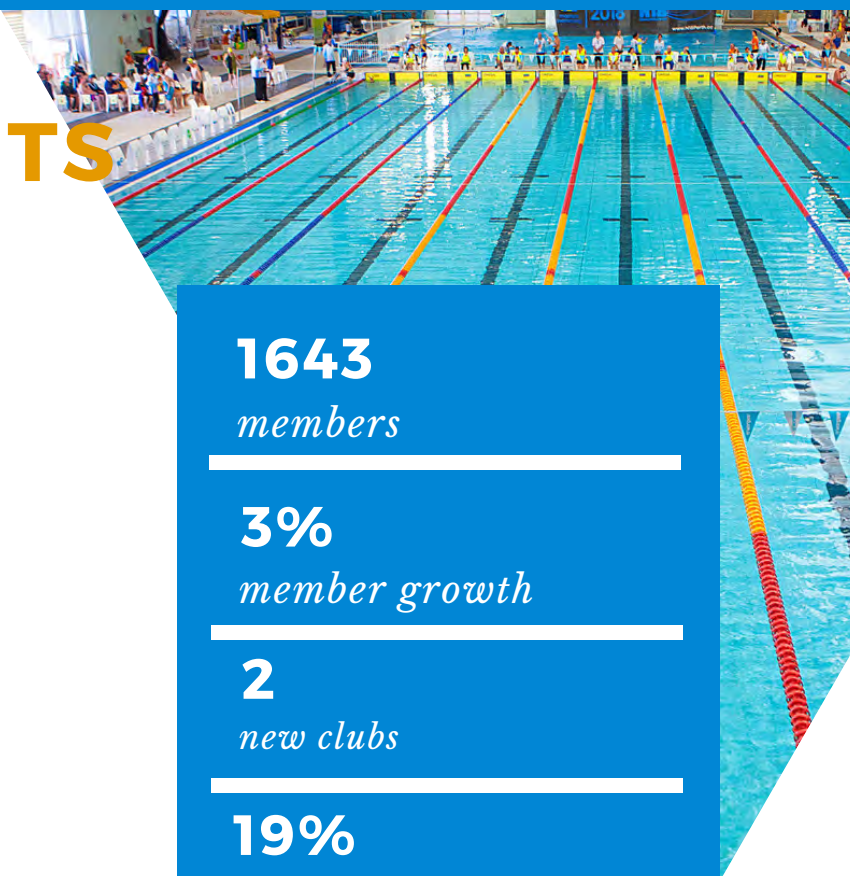

The event consisted of four days of competition and was packed with other activities in which swimmers could participate. The Hon. Roger Cook MLA opened the meet at an opening ceremony, which also saw new MSA Patron Priya Cooper introduced. Other activities included a welcome function with welcome packs given to each swimmer, a souvenir program, daily raffles, a presentation dinner as well as the sale of a range of N18 merchandise on poolside each day. The event was supported by six Event Partners and 30 sponsors, being the largest line up of sponsors at a Masters Swimming National Championships.

This mammoth event was organised and run entirely by over 120 volunteers and officials and was without doubt, a huge success for MSA

The 2018 Masters Swimming Australia National Championships (N18) was held at HBF Stadium, Perth from 18 - 21st April 2018. The premier event on the Masters Swimming Australia calendar attracted 632 registrations, a record for a Western Australian hosted Nationals and almost 15% more swimmers than originally projected. Just under half of all entrants came from interstate, as well as seven international competitors and the remainder from regional and metropolitan WA.

# OPEN WATER EVENTS

2018 saw Masters Swimming WA and its clubs host seven open water swims. With the open water season being over the course of the summer, four of these swims were conducted during the 2017/18 season and three over the 2018/19 season under the new WOW Swims brand.

The Rockingham Ocean Classic was added to the calendar in 2018 for the 2017/18 open water season incorporating the Masters State Championship, which previously had been included into the Fremantle Ports Swim Thru.

Following the conclusion of the 2017/18 season, planning for the 2018/19 season saw the introduction of a new umbrella brand, **WOW Swims**, 'the community swim series for all'.

Marketing and promotion has included a new website, new Facebook page, new email newsletter, new open water swim signage and equipment. Promoting the Masters open water swims via the new brand as well as cross promotion between the host club swims has resulted in each swim achieving their highest swimmer numbers ever.

Thirteen LiveLighter events were held during 2018 that included:

- Four LiveLighter Club Challenges

The Masters Swimming WA State Championship results were extrapolated from the National Championships hosted by Masters Swimming WA at HBF Stadium. Claremont took out the top place ahead of Beatty Park. Rockingham received the Handicap Award while Mandurah was awarded the Top Country Club. Helen Bird was awarded the Female Swimmer of the Meet and Graham Croft won the Male Swimmer of the Meet.

The LiveLighter Golden Groper Relay Championships saw 222 swimmers from 12 clubs compete, with Claremont taking out first place. Two National and five State Relay Records were set by Claremont, along with Perth City and Mandurah also setting state records. Three individual state records were set by lead off swimmers.

# COACHING

Our coaching committee has had a busy year with a number of clinics and a Club Coach Course during the year.

## Superclinic

Early in the year, providing race preparation for the Nationals, Elena Nesci and Siobhan Wilkins hosted a Superclinic that incorporated officials for training purposes. The clinic was an enormous success with great feedback from participants.

## 'Take Your Heart to Training'

Kim Tyler hosted a 'Take your Heart to Training' clinic for Belmont Masters during July. The session had been specifically requested by the club and covered how to use heart rate as a measure of effort in training. The clinic was very well received and helped swimmers understand why their coaches include different sets in their sessions.

## Coaches Professional Development

In July and August, high performance and ASCTA Gold Licence Accredited swim coach, Mel Tantrum hosted two coaching clinics at Beatty Park. The first clinic covered theory and practical demonstration of freestyle and



backstroke technique and the second clinic covered breaststroke and butterfly. Mel's engaging style and depth of knowledge was fantastically well received from coaches.

## Club Coach Course

In October, Kim Tyler and her presenting team, Jon Haines and Elena Nesci, conducted a Club Coach Course, which is an essential component of Club Coach Accreditation. Twelve candidates completed the preliminary work and the required workshop. In addition to the sixteen 2017 candidates who have now completed their pool deck coaching under supervision hours, we continue to develop a strong stable of accredited coaches.

New processes have been introduced to streamline the accreditation process and we continue to work with MSA to refine the coaching information and resources to ensure it is simple, thorough and informative.

## Coach Education Team

The Coach Education Team also saw two newly accredited Club Coach Presenters and Assessors with Jon Haines and Siobhan Wilkins successfully completing the required modules. This now brings the Coach Education Team to four, improving our ability to hold more frequent Club Coach Courses in the future.



# TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

## Annual Workshop

2018 was an extremely busy year for Masters Swimming WA Technical Officials, with the first major event of the year being the Annual Technical Official's Workshop held in February. Run concurrently with a coaching clinic presented by the Director of Coaching, both sessions provided material and course content targeting the two specific groups and culminated with Technical Officials offering advice with respect to swimming rules and stroke transgressions to the coaches and several swimmers who registered as part of the coaching clinic. This unique format proved highly successful and will be offered again in 2019.

## 2018 Nationals

With MSWA hosting the National Masters Swimming Championships in April, four of our senior MSWA Referees were invited to form part of the Technical Sub-Committee and contribute to all technical aspects of the event such as providing advice, specifying requirements for officiating, pool set up, safety and swimming rules. The event provided the opportunity for three MSWA Referees to take on the role of Meet Referee providing the Officials

the opportunity to work at such an auspicious event. The Technical Officials were a valuable part of the success of the Nationals event.

## Collaboration Swimming WA

The 2018 Nationals also provided the opportunity to invite Swimming WA officials to work collaboratively with MSWA officials, by providing additional support. This strategy has proven very successful and resulted in at least two Swimming WA Officials becoming MSWA Officials and being eligible for inclusion as part of the MSWA Official's Roster.

## Courses

A Technical Course for Inspector of Turns and Judge of Stroke was held in July welcoming four new trainee officials to MSWA with two of them already accruing the hours necessary for qualification in specific roles. We look forward to their continuing development.
