3.1 Update from Committee Chairs

♦ Coaching Committee – Siobhan Wilkins

SW advised a EOI for coaches has been distributed and a pool formed to deliver swimmer education and community programs.

Theme for Coaches Conference on 15 October is Open Water Swimming with a number of guest speakers secured. Presenters will be a mix of Masters Coaches and external speakers

♦ Open Water Committee – Kate Baxter

Open Water Committee met and confirmed dates for this upcoming season. All WOW forms and compliance documents have been updated and distributed to host clubs

♦ Technical Committee – Lynne Duncan

Updated rules and event guides will be tabled at the MSA Spring General Meeting on 21 October. There is updated rules to Open Water Swims and new rules will take effect 3 weeks after tabling and ratification by Branches.

We are planning several education sessions, namely Inspector of Turns, Judge of Strokes and Starter. Dates to be confirmed and clubs advised. Please encourage members to undertake the courses as the number of Technical Officials is limited but crucial for events.

3.2 Overview of completed pool events

3.3 Summer Solstice Swim

Summer Solstice planned over 3 days with the key date being 22 December. Handicapping system so entries ratioed to club member percentage so smaller clubs can have equal opportunity of winning. There will also be a minimum number of entries to go into the event and guidelines regarding the submission of photos.

3.4 Allianz Swim Club SG

SG provided an overview of the Allianz Swim Club project that is in partnership with MSA and AustSwim.

15 clubs Nationally are involved with Mandurah, Leeming and Somerset participating in WA for the pilot program commencing on October 9th.

Adults that do not know how to swim have been provided vouchers for free lessons for 8 weeks at AustSwim. Each centre has 50 registrations, making total participation Nationally 800 participants. Most centres reached capacity within the first week of advertising. Following the lessons, participants will then be provided 3-month free membership to the Masters club.

Welcome Officers from each club have been appointed and they will assist the swimmers to transition into the club through social events. Clubs will receive funding support of \$1500 each and MSWA \$2000.

In response to this, a question was raised from the floor regarding flexible membership models for MSA and MSWA to increase membership options. Kate Baxter as a member of the National Membership

Committee responded that this is a topic discussed at the meetings, but no progress has been made to date.

It is a matter that MSWA have raised previously and will continue to address with MSA.

3.5 Future Funding SG

DLGSC funding of \$70k for the next 2 years secured. Application made to Healthway for resourcing and a number of different programs to increase membership and build awareness of MSWA. Virtual club Sandgropers are changing name. Registered business name Swim West for Sandgropers and delivery of community programs.

4.1 Motions submitted to MSA for Spring General Meeting

FW advised the council that 2 motions had been submitted to MSA for Spring General Meeting.

- 1) To increase the distance of Open Water Swims to 25kms. This is to provide greater options for members and the opportunity to set new times and records
- 2) MSA to manage and host the National Pool Championships annually rather than the event being allocated to Branches on a rotational basis. This is due to the burden on volunteers.

A question from the floor enquiring if MSWA or delegates had heard of any more pools being built in Perth. General discussion followed but no new information regarding pools was forthcoming.

A suggestion was made that clubs should explore access to swimming pools at schools and build up a partnership for use.
